At the request of Andrew Robeson that we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in this province for which he doth agree to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> use fifty pounds and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres forerer. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Andrew Robeson back of the settlements made on the River Schuylkill the said quantity of five hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretarijs Office which survey in case the said Andrew fulfill the above agreement within three months after location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 13<sup>th</sup> day of the sixth month A.D.


