

I do hereby Certifie That by vertue of a warr<sup>e</sup> under the hand and seal of Edward Penington Surveyor General to David Powel directed bearing date the first day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1701 pursuant to the Proprietaries warr<sup>e</sup> to the said Edward Penington dated the 29<sup>th</sup> day of the first month 1701 He the said David Powel hath made Return into the Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyors office of the Resurvey of a Tract of Land Resurvey<sup>d</sup> to Martha Keite the 28<sup>day</sup> of the month and year first above mentioned which being examined and Revised in the said office is as follows Situate on the west side of Schuylkill in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a Stake erected in the line of John Roberts's Land from thence by a line of marked trees and the land of David R. north north west 210 perches to a stake in Robert Loyds line thence by the same line East north east 192 perches to a stake near a black oak Sapling marked from thence South 30 degrees easterly 18 perches: South 31 degrees east<sup>ly</sup> 18 perches: South 18 degrees easterly 22 perches: south 31 degrees easterly 40 perches: South 39 degr<sup>s</sup> easterly 18 perches: south 33 degr<sup>s</sup> east<sup>ly</sup> 10 perches: south <sup>40 deg</sup> easterly 18 perches: south 45 degrees easterly 16 perches: south 35 easterly 13 perches: south 47 degrees easterly 12 perches: south 24 degrees easterly 20 perches from thence south 54 degrees westerly 84 perches from thence by a line of mark'd trees and the land of the aforesaid John Roberts West south west One hundred and fifty perches to the place of beginning containing two hundred and seventy acres
