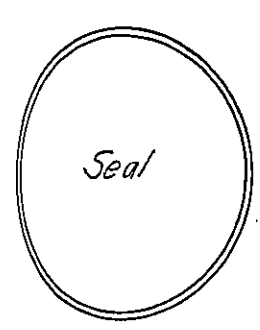

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of Martha Hatten Daughter of Will^m Hatten^{deceased} That I would grant her to take up five hundred Acres of Land in Right of James Harrison old Purchaser, These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto her the said Number of Acres of Land in this Province not already taken up, survey'd, nor concealed to be laid out according to the Method of Townships by me appointed. She taking out a Patent for y^e Same within three Months after thou shalt make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office which thou art hereby required to doe with all convenient Speed Given under my Hand and Seal at Pensbury the 2^d day of the 7th Moth 1700 To Edw^d Pennington Surveyor General W^m Penn of y^e Province of Pennsylvania & Territories

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Twentieth day of September 1909
