



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in the County of Philadelphia surveyed the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1702 unto Edward Singleton Attorney for Richard Haines containing five hundred acres in right of a purchase of two thousand five hundred acres by him made of Matthew Marks first purchaser of five thousand acres, pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 12<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1700, and is accordingly Returned into the Secretary's Office the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1701
