the said number of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province not already
Survey'd nor Concealed in the third Township, that after the date hereof shall
be laid out, according to the Method by me appointed. He taking out a Patent
for the same within three Months after thou makes Returns thereof into my
Sec^{ry}s Office, w^{ch} thou art hereby required to doe with all convenient Speed.
Given under my Hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 12th day of the 10th Moth 1700*
