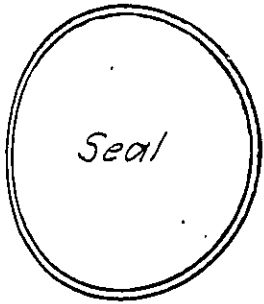

*William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties Annexed*

*At the Request of Richard Haines by his Attorney Edward Singleton That I would
grant him to take up five Hundred Acres of Land in right of a purchase of two
thousand five hundred Acres by him made of Matthew Marks first purchaser of five
thousand Acres, of which 2500, five hundred are already granted to be taken up
These are to require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Rich^d Haines the
said Number of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province not already Survey'd, nor
Concealed, in the first Township that after the date hereof shall be laid out, according
to the Method by me Appointed, He taking out a Patent for the same within three
Months after thou shalt make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office w^{ch} thou art
hereby required to doe wth all convenient speed Given under my Hand & Seal at
Philadelphia the 12th day of 10th Moth 1700.*
