


Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 12th day of the 10th month 1700.

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Edward Singleton Attorney for Richard Haines in right of a purchase of two thousand five hundred acres by him made of Matthew Marks first Purchaser of five thousand acres, a certain Tract of Land situate in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a stake sett in the ground standing by a Road dividing it from the Township of Limerick, from thence by a Line of marked trees North East five hundred perches to another stake sett in the ground hard by a marked black oak, from thence North West one hundred and sixty perches by a Line of marked trees to another corner stake dividing it from a Tract of Land reserved for Nathaniel Puckle from thence South West by a Line of trees marked dividing this Tract from the above mentioned Tract five hundred perches to a marked black oak, from thence South East by a Line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to the first corner stake, containing and laid out for five hundred acres. Surveyed the 15th day of the 11th month 1701 and Returned according to the above said Survey and Bonds into the Proprietary and Governours Secretary's Office the 10th day of the 2^d month 1701.
