



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1740 I have resurveyed for the use of Thomas Bishop Vickris the proportion of Liberty L<sup>d</sup> formerly laid out to his father & Uncle Rich<sup>d</sup> & Robert Vickris (in right of their purchase of 2000 in this Province) Situate in the northern Liberties of Philad<sup>a</sup> City contain<sup>g</sup> 32 acres.

Resurveyed the 19<sup>th</sup> of May 1741.
