
At ye request of John Test, yt I would grant him to take up ye Three two hundred and  
fifty <sup>acres</sup> Lots, ~~he~~ (obl.) allowed him by me in lieu, of the seven foot & an half w<sup>th</sup> are shortner  
of Charles Pickring. These are to will and require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey, or cause to be  
survey'd unto him ye said three town Lots, (sett out for Purchasers of ye like number  
of acres) in ye third street, of this city, fifty foot in breath, and three hundred and  
ninety six foot in length, and make returns thereof into my Secretary's office. Given  
at Philadelphia, the 29<sup>th</sup> of ye first Month 1683.
