



The Lot or Piece of Ground sold by Nehemiah ^{N. Allen} Allen to Joseph ^(Taylor) lying on the second street of Philadelphia on Delaware side between Walnut street and Spruce Street. Begins at ^a Corner of Joseph Shippers lot on the west ^{side} of the second street, from thence ~~by~~ south eighteen degrees west by the said second street seventeen feet and five inches to a corner of Nehemiah Allens dwelling house Then north seventy two degrees west by the said house twenty three feet and six inches. Then south sixty three degrees west ^{14 f 4 inches} to another corner of the said Allens house Then south eighteen degrees west by the back part of the house eight foot and one inch Then north seventy two degrees west by the said N. Allens ground seventy nine feet and four inches to the Garden pales. Then north eighteen degrees east nine feet and ten inches. Then by the said Allens ground north seventy two degrees west one hundred eighty seven feet. Then north eighteen degrees east twenty five foot and a half foot Then south seventy two degrees east by the said Jos. Shippers Lot three hundred foot to the beginning.
