Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye request of Thomas Vernon Purchaser of six hundred and twenty <sup>five</sup> acres of  
land, yt I would grant him to take up his Proportion of land w<sup>th</sup>in ye Liberties of ye  
City. These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd  
unto him his portion of land w<sup>th</sup>in ye bounds thereof, he seating & improving  
ye same according to Regulation, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's  
Office. Given at Philadelphia ye 19<sup>th</sup> of ye 4<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
