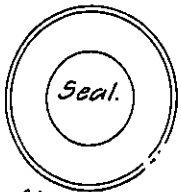


Pensylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Joshua Tittery of Philadelphia. That we would grant him to take up a small piece of Vacant Ground lying between the back ends of his two Lots in ye. Second street and the third street between Mulberry & Sassatras streets for w<sup>ch</sup> he has agreed to pay after the rate of four shillings for every foot in breadth on the s<sup>d</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> street and the usual Quitrent. These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the said Joshua the s<sup>d</sup> vacant piece of ground and make returns thereof into the general Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> ye 26<sup>th</sup> of the first month (March) 1706.
