At the request of Joseph Tanner by his attorney Nathaniel Puckle. That I would grant him to take up two hundred acres of land the remainder of five hundred acres untaken up, purchased of me by the sd Jos Tanner. These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyd (according to the method of townships by me appointed) to the sd Joseph Tanner the sd number of two hundred acres of land in this Province That has not been already surveyd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given at Philadelphia the 8th day of the 6th moth 1701.
