 ye said Sellers eighty three pr to a corner post. Thence no. no. west by
 ye same and line of marked trees ninty four pr to a marked post
 Thence west so. west by Samuel Hood's land one hundred pr to a
 marked Gurne tree Thence so. so. east easterly by ye meadow of William
 Garret eighty one pr to a marked post Then west so west by ye sd meadow
 thirty pr to a marked post Thence south so. east by ye land of Mikell Bluns-
 tone one hundred & ninteen pr to a marked white oake Thence ea. no.
 east by ye land of Roger Ball seventy two pr to ye place of Beginning con-
 taining one hundred and eighteen acres of land. pr Da^d Llewelyn.
