

By virtue of a warrant under the hands of the Com<sup>rs</sup> of Property and the seal of the Province dated the 16<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>mo</sup> 1701. for resurveying unto Benjamin Farlow his lands formerly taken up and surveying unto him the complement of his land undertaken up.

Survey'd and laid out unto Benjamin Farlow one thousand and nine hundred acres of land in the County of Philadel<sup>a</sup> beginning at a white oak standing by Schuylkill at the corner of land belonging to the Frankford Company and from thence extending by the said land northeast nine hundred and fifty per. to a Spanish oak from thence south east three hundred and twenty perches to a post Then by the land of the London Company south west nine hundred eighty six per. to a Spanish oak by Schoolkil Then up the sd River following ye sev<sup>al</sup> courses ye of to the place of Beginning. Survey'd by Thomas Fairman the 18<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> 1702.
