At ye request of Peter Yeakim, yt I would grant him to have surveyd & layd  
out for him thirty acres of Meadow Ground <sup>in ye marsh</sup> joyning to his Plantation on  
Skulkill where he now liveth upon. These are to will & require three fourth<sup>th</sup>  
to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him ye said number of acres of good  
Meadow, in ye aforementioned ~~place~~ place, & make returns thereof into my  
Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia ye 25<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
