



Pursuant to a warrant from the proprietors Commiss^{rs} of P^rpty bearing date the 27th 2^d mo. 1702 directed unto me I hereby certify that I have resurveyed and laid out unto myself a certaine lot in Philadelphia bounded on the east with the 2^d street from Delaware by a line north ~~18~~ 18 degrees west 35 feet and one the north by a line west 18 degrees north deviding it from a lot reputed to be laid out for Robert Lodge 303 feet and one the west with back lots by a line south 18 degrees west 35 feet and one the south by a line east 18 degrees south ~~35~~ deviding it from Phillip Howells lot 303 feet to the plac of beginneing with another pecc of a lot granted in exchange for part of ye said lot first mentioned bounded on the east by a line north 18 degrees east deviding it from the said Lodge his lot 20 feet and one the north by a line West 18 degrees north deviding it from the widdw Hards lot 190 feet and one the west by a line south 18 degrees west by the 3^d street 20 feet and one the south by a line east 18 degrees south deviding it from John Swifts lot 190 feet to the plac of beginneing and is according to ye bounds above described returned into the Generall Survey^r offic at Philadelphia the 19th day of ye 3^d mo. 1702.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eleventh day of January 1910.
