high street in ye City of Philadelphia, proportionable to his Purchase.  
These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd  
unto him in ye 5<sup>d</sup> street a Lott answering Two thousand acres, &  
make returns thereof into my Secretarys office. Given at Philadel-  
phia ye 2<sup>d</sup> of ye 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1683.
