

By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries Commissioners of Property bearing date the 4th of the 11th month 170^{3/4} to lay out unto Robert Ashton of Philad^{ia} Gent. five hundred acres of land in part and right of three thousand acres granted by the said Robers Father. There was surveyed and laid out unto the said Robert Ashton the 18th day of the 4th month 170⁴ a tract of land in the County of Chester Beginning at a Black oak at the Corner John Budds land and in the line of the London Companies land Thence extending by the said line north two hundred thirty nine Pches and one half part of a perch to a post Thence west three hundred and thirty four perches to a post Then south two hundred thirty nine perches and one half of a perch to a black oak Then by the line of the said John Budds land east three hundred and thirty four perches to the Beginning Containing five hundred acres of Henry Hollingsworth Revised in the General Surveyors office.
