At ye request of Philip Alford, yt his City Lott proportionable to his Pur-  
chase of one hundred & ~~Twenty~~ five acres might be layd out. These  
are to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be sur-  
veyd unto him a lott in ye fourth street on Delaware side an-  
swerable, sett out for purchasers of ye like quantity, and make  
returns thereof into my Secretarys office. Given at Philadelphia  
ye 16<sup>th</sup> of ye <sup>1770</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> 1683.
