These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will & require thee forthwith to examine thy office very strictly for ye said warrant & if found to make speedy returne thereof to ye Secretarys office; but if not & yt thou art well assured yt ye Proprietor and Govern^r had directed such a warrant to thee Then thou art hereby required to certify into ye Secretarys office ~~that~~ ye time ye aforesaid warrant was executed with ye bounds & courses of ye said five hundred acres of land.
