At the request of Mary and Alice Hind Administratrixes on the
estate of John Atkinson joint Purchaser with his Brother Christ-
opher Atkinson of fifteen hundred acres, That I would grant them to
take up five hundred acre (obl.) of land in right of the sd John Atkin-
son's children. These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause
to be survey'd to the use of the said child (obl.) the aforesaid num-
ber of acres (being their full share of ye sd Purchase) of land not al-
ready taken up nor survey'd nor concealed. They taking out a Patent
for the same within three months after thou shalt make returns
thereof into my Secretaries office, w^{ch} thou art hereby required to ~~doe~~
with all convenien (obl.) speed Given under my hand and seal of Phila-
delphia the 12th day of 7^{ber} 1700.
