These are to require thee to survey and lay out to the said John Streipers the quantity of ~~four~~ four thousand six hundred and seventy five acres of land in one tract as aforesaid where not already surveyed nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make returns of into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary who is also to take a duplicate of thy return into his office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 23^d of the 12th moth 1701.
