By virtue of two Warrants from the Proprietaries each to lay out to Ralph Assheton Esq<sup>r</sup> the quantity of two thousand five hundred acres of land in this Province. One dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of February 1733. The other (obl.) the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1734-5. There was surveyed the said Quantity in (o-b-l.) tracts (obl.) (obl.) with (o-b-l.) with (obl.) County of Philadelphia. One tract situate on Schuylkil River on the <sup>north</sup> east side <sup>(obl.)</sup> in the County of Philadelphia (obl.) about five miles westward from Survey<sup>d</sup> the 19<sup>th</sup> of Febr<sup>y</sup> 1733 Oley<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a Hickery tree on the Eastern bank of the said River at a corner of George Clapps land & extending thence by the same north seventy degrees east one hundred ninety one perches to a white oak thence by vacant land south twenty degrees east five hundred & ten perches to a black oak sapling and south seventy degrees west one hundred perches to a Hickery tree and south twenty degrees east forty perches to a post thence by land surveyed for the use of the Proprietaries south seventy degrees west two hundred eighty seven perches to a <sup>Hickery tree by</sup> Schuylkil River aforesaid thence up by the same on several courses to the place of beginning containing one thousand and twenty four acres and the Allowance of six acres & Cent for roads & high Ways. Another tract situate on the same side of the said River about eight miles westward from (obl.) (O-b-l-i-t-e-r-a-t-e-d) th day of February 1733 Begin (O-b-l-i-t-e-r-a-t-e-d) (O-b-l-i-t-e-r-a-t-e-d) twenty (obl.) acres west three hundred perches to a white oak & south seventy degre(obl.) west four hundred perches to the said River thence down by the same on several courses to the place of beginning. Containing seven hundred acres & Allowance as afores<sup>d</sup>. Another tract situate on a branch of the said River called Andirihela in the Co. afores<sup>d</sup>. In Pursuance of the above mentioned warrants the seven several tracts of land Draughts of w<sup>ch</sup> are inclosed & numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, were surveyed to Ralph Assheton in order to be granted to him in trust for certain uses. Returned &c. as on several of the s<sup>d</sup> Draughts is (obl.) iterated) wh also w<sup>ch</sup> with the other on w<sup>ch</sup> no such moves are (obl.) all returned into the Sec<sup>y</sup>s office the 29<sup>th</sup> of July 1741.
