These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed ~~or cause to be surveyed~~ unto the said Rich^d Adams within the City of Philad^a a lot of ground and in the Liberties thereof the proportion of Liberty land where the same may be found vacant and not Lawfully claimed by any other person and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation. Given under our hands and the lesser seal of the Province at Philadelphia the first day of September Anno Dni 1725.
