At the request of Daniel and Justus Falkner Attorneys for Benjamin Furly Purchaser of five thousand acres of land in this Province and in pursuance of a grant & special ord<sup>r</sup> from the Proprietary. These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey to the said Benjamin all such tracts and Parcels of land in the sd Province as have been laid out to the said Benjamin, in right of his said Purchase, that are now reputed to belong to the said Benjamin, and further to survey and lay out to the said Benjamin Furly according to the method of townships the full Complement of his sd five thousand acres that has not been already taken up, of such land as is not yet survey'd nor concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make returns thereof into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> thee certified by the Secretary who is to take a duplicate of thy return into his office. Given under our hands & the seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 16<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
