



W. Trent's land in the Manor of Moorland begins at a heap of stones at a corner of Thomas Morris his land.

- N.E. 56 Small run into it (i.e. Running into Trent's Land.)
- Ditto 110 Tearwood Run out over it swamp and meadow.
- Ditto 71 Small white oak sappling
- S.E. 32 Small run out
- Ditto 26 Post.
- N.E. 50 Small run out
- Ditto 112 Penny pack Creek
- Ditto 64 Spanish oak mark^d for a corner.
- N.W. 24 Penny pack Creek
- Obi. - Up (Obi.) Creek
- N^o 50 W 29 The creek bearing a little off to the right not very much nor crooked (Obi.)
- N 14 W 60 To a run running into the Creek which now bears to the right 10p (Obi.)
- E. 14 To the Creek
- N 20 E 24
- N 40 E 28
- N 60 E 17 To the Creek which near the end of the 60p bears off in a bend 12 (Obi.)
- N 15 W 10
- N by E 16
- N W 151
- S.W. 204 Post
- N.W. 234 This corner is in a curious bottom then S.W. over a run & meadow 200 (Obi.)
- S.W. 384 From this corner 230p to the side of Hog swamp. Thence 160p. to Te (Obi.)
- S.E. 450
