Whereas by consent of the late Commissioners of Property there was surveyed about the year 1719 To Elisha Gatchell the quantity of three hundred acres of land in the County of Lancaster Now in pursuance of a warrant from the Proprietaries to me directed bearing date the 31st day of March A.D. 1735 To receive the sd survey into my office, and to make a return thereof into the Secretary's Office; I do hereby certify, that the said Tract of land is limited & bounded as followeth, Vizt Situate in the County of Lancaster afores^d ^{in Drummore Towne} Beginning at a marked white oak Tree thence by vacant land East south east one hundred & seventy three perches to a post, thence by land laid out to Henry Reynolds north north east two hundred ninety four perches to a post, thence by vacant land west north west one hundred seventy three perches to a white oak, thence by vacant land south south west two hundred ninety four perches to the place of Beginning Contain^g three hundred acres & the allowance of six acres & cent for roads &c. Returned into the Secretary's Office the first day of April A.D. 1735.
