At the Request of Jeremiah Simmons of London Turner by his
 Seal. Son and Christopher Blackborne his Attornys That we would
 Grant him to Take up five hundred Acres of Land in this Province
 in Right of Thomas Fuller late of Peasnan in the County of Suffolk Yeoman
 who purchased the Same of the Prop^r by Indentures of Lease & Release
 bearing Date the fifth & Sixth days of June 1682. Whose only Daughter
 Prudence Bruster to whome the Said Five Hundred Acres of Right
 Desend'd Together with her Husband Thomas Bruster of Brandon Ferry
 in the Said County Grocer by like Deeds Dated The Twelfth and Thirteenth
 Days of January 1712. Granted the Said five Hundred Acres of Land to
 Edward Wartnaby & Elizth his wife who by their Deeds Dated the Sixth day
 of February ^{then} Next Ensuing Granted all the Said five Hundred Acres of
 Land unto the Said Jeremiah Simmons.

These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd
 unto the Said Jeremiah Simmons According to the Methods of Townships Ap-
 pointed the Said Quantity of five Hundred Acres of Land in this Province
 That has not been Already Survey'd nor Appropriated nor is Seated by
 the Indians and make a Returne there of into the Secretarys Office in
 Order to a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and Seale
 of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the fourth Month Anno
 Din. 1714.
