By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of William Branton That we would Grant him to take up Five Hundred Acres of Land in this Province for which he hath agreed to pay to the Prop^rs use fiftie pounds and the usual Quitrent of one Shilling^{sterling} for Each hundred Acres @ Annum. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd (obl.) the Said William Branton according to the Method of Townships Appointed the Said Quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in the Said Province that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians. And make returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation, Which Survey in case the Said William fulfill the afore said Agreement within three Months after Location shall be Valid, otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warran—ever Granted. Given under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 27th of the first Month 1714.
