These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd
to the Said Charles Jones according to the Method of Townships appointed
the ^{s^d} Quantity of two hundred and fiftie Acres of Land in the Said Pro-
vince That has not been already Survey'd nor Appropriated nor is
Seated by the Indians, And make a Returne thereof into the Sec-
retarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation. Which Survey
in case the said Charles fulfill the aforesaid Agreement within
^{after Location} three Months, shall be Valid, otherwise the Same is to be Void as if
it had never been made nor this Warrant ever Granted. Given
under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the
27th of the first Month 1714.
