take up five hundred Acres of Land formerly granted by me to his
father Jn^o Jagger at Windsor. These are to require thee forth-
with to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him according to the
Method of Townships by me appointed the said Number of five
hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has not been al-
ready survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by
the Indians and make returns thereof into my Secretaries Office
w^{ch} Survey being duly made and return'd, if seated within twe-
lve Months after shall be confirmed to him & his Heirs for
ever. Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the
6th of 1^{mo} 170^o.
