I have surveyd and Laid out unto David Joans a Certaine tract of Land within the
bounds of the C_{ity} Libarty upon the West sid_e of Scoohe_l begining at a stak_sett
in the ground in a Line of Hugh Robarts Land from thence West South West by a Line
of marked trees 95 p_ches to another stak_sett in the ground from thence North by
a Line of marked trees 89 perches to a stak_sett in the ground in the Line of William
Edwards Land from thence by a Line of marked trees and same Land West South
West 182 perches to another stak_sett in the same Line from thence by a Line of marked
trees South South East 199 perches to another stak_sett in the ground in a Line that
bounds the Land of Willm Warner from thence by the said Line of marked trees East
2 degrees North 183 perches to a Hickry marked deviding it from Hugh Robarts Land
from thence North by a Line of marked trees and same Land 199 perches to the pt
ace of begining Containing 286 acres and 98 perches: 250 acres of it by Vertue
of the said War^t and the rest by order from James Logan being dat^r ye
26: of ye 2^d mo^r Ensuing the wh_is now anexed. Surveyd the 28th of the 2^d
mo^r 170¹.
