Upon an agreement now made with Derrick Johnsen of German Town for Eight hundred Acres of Land to be laid out to him back of the settlements & surveys lately made in this Province for which he is to pay to the use of the Trustees of this Province. Thirteen pounds ten shillings current Mony & ye Yearly Quitrent of One shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Derrick Johnsen <sup>back</sup> among the Said late Surveys made <sup>back</sup> in ye Said Province According to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of eight hundred acres of Land either in one or two parcels that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns there of into the Secretarys Office. which Survey in case the Said Derrick fulfill the above agreem<sup>t</sup> by paying down ye Consideration Mony within three months after the date hereof shall be Valid, otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted.
