William Penn, Absolute Proprietary and Governour
in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Countys
annexed.

Whereas by my Order to my Comm^{rs} of Property bearing date the 15th
day of the fifth Month 1686 I granted to Jacob Isaacs purchaser of
one thousand Acres, one third part of an Acre in some Convenient
Street within the City ^{of} Philadelphia. In pursuance of which Ord^r my
said Comm^{rs} granted a Warr^t bearing date the 15th of the 12th Moth
1688⁸ directed to Thomas Holme - to lay out one third part of an Acre
as aforesaid, but was never executed. These therefore are to
require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the sd Jacob
Isaacs the said third part of an Acre of Land in the City Phila-
delphia, in some convenient Street thereof, not interfering wth
the first purchasers right therein and make Returns thereof
into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand & Seal at Phi-
lad^o the 25th day of the Second Moth 1701.
