

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 28th of September 1719. There was Surveyd and Set out on the 19th day of February 1719/20 unto Derrick Jansen of Germantown (in Right of Thomas Parkhurst Citizen and Stationer of London) a Certain Tract of Land on a Branch of Perqueomink in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a Post at a Corner of Christian Myar's Land. Thence North East by the same one hundred forty Eight perches to a Post. thence North West by a Line of Trees two hundred and forty perches to a Post. Then by Vacant Land South West two hundred ninety eight perches to a Large White Oak. Then South East by a line of Marked trees three hundred perches to a post in John Rudd's line. Then by the said John Rudd's land North East forty five perches to a Black Oak at a Corner of the said Rudd's land. Then by the same South East forty two perches to a Post at a Corner of John Isaac Clyn's Land. Then by the same North East one hundred and five perches to a Corner of Hans Myars Land. Then by the Land of the aforesaid Christian Myar's North West one hundred and two perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Five hundred acres With allowance of Six acres & Cent.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty sixth day of October 1909.
