him yesd Number of Acres in ye aforementioned County where not  
already taken up according to ye Method of Townships appointed  
by me, he seating & improving the same w<sup>th</sup> in One Year after  
ye Date of ye survey, & make Returne thereof into my Secretary's  
Office. Given at Philadelphia ye 29<sup>th</sup> of ye 5<sup>th</sup> mo 1684.
