By Vertue of a warrant from the Commission^{r's} bareing date the day of the moneth 170 $\frac{1}{2}$ to survey and layout unto Griffeth Jones the complement of his Land untaken up. I certifie to the Surveyor^{r's} Gen^{l's} office that I have surveyed and layed out to him in part there of. Six Hundred acres in the County of Philadelphia. Begining at a corner Marked red oake being the corner of James Claypoole's Land. Thence South west by the same four Hundred and Eighty perches to a corner marked Hickrey. Thence South East by a line of marked trees & the Land of James Petree Two Hundred perches to a post for another corner. Thence North East by the Land of William Jones four Hundred and Eighty perches to a post standing neare a bla. oake Saplin - marked for a corner. Thence North west by John Days Land &c. Two Hundred perches to the first mention'd black oake tree. & place of begining.
