

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary and Governour dated the 21<sup>st</sup> of 8<sup>br</sup> 1701 for Surveying to Andreas Rudman and Company 10000 acres of Land. There was Survey'd on the 28<sup>th</sup> of July 1704 for Mouns-Jones a Tract of Land in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a post on the East side of the River Schuylkil at a Corner of Justa Justasons land thence by the same North twenty degrees East eight hundred and seventy perches to a post. Again by the same land (Justason's) East South East seventy three perches to a post. Then by a line of Andreas Rudman's land South twenty degrees west eight hundred ninety six perches to the said River Sulki then up the same to the Place of beginning. Containing four hundred & two acres.
