Pennsilvania and ye Territories thereunto belonging.


At ye Request of John Gee & Comp<sup>o</sup> Purchasers of Five Thous-  
 and Acres y<sup>t</sup> I would grant y<sup>m</sup> to take up four hundred Acres of  
 Land in ye County of Philadelphia. And at Robert Turners Re-  
 quest y<sup>t</sup> he might have Three hundred & twenty Acres of Land  
 in p<sup>t</sup> of his purchase layd out adjoyning thereunto. These are  
 to will & require thee forth w<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be surveyd  
 unto y<sup>m</sup> seven hundred and twenty Acres in ye County afore  
 said, where not already taken up according to ye Method of Town-  
 ships appointed by me, they seating & improving ye same accord-  
 ing to Regulation, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office  
 Given at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> of ye 3<sup>d</sup> mo. 1684.
