At the Request of Joseph Growdon in behalf of the Heirs of George
Fox That I would grant him to take up for Dan^l Abraham four hundred
and eight Acres and one third of an Acre of Land in this Province being one
third of the s^d George Fox's Original purchase of 1250 Acres bequeathed
by the s^d George in his last Will and Testament to the s^d Daniel Abraham
and his Children. These are to require thee forthwth to survey
or cause to be survey'd to the s^d Dan^l Abraham and his Children
the s^d Number of four hundred and eight Acres and one third of
an Acre of Land in this Province not already taken up nor conceal'd
nor seated by the Indians, and make Returns there of into my
Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philade-
lphia the 10th day of 8^{ber} 1701.
