Surveyed unto him ye 5<sup>d</sup> Lotts in the City where they fell, he  
fenceing & building upon ye Front Lott fenceing & clearing his  
high street Lott w<sup>th</sup> in six Months from ye date of Survey and  
make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office Philadelphia the 17<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1684.
