

By Vertue of a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property dated the 12th day of ye 8th month 1703 for laying out unto John Guest Esq^r. in ye Square made by Vine Street, Sassafras Street and the fourth Street ~~Street~~ from Delaware at the distance of two hundred foot from the Sassafras Street one Lott of one hundred foot in Breadth on the third and fourth Streets to be held by him his Heirs and assigns for ever under the Yearly Quitrent of ten shill^{ings} Sterling & Annun together with the Northermost remaining part of ye said Square being about two hundred and Eighty foot in Breadth and in Depth from the 3^d third to the fourth Street to be held by the said John Guest his Executors, administra^{rs} and Assigns during the space of twenty one Years from the first month Next ensuing to be fully compleat and ended under the Yearly Rent of ten shillings Sterling & Annum.

Surveyd the 10th of the 10th month 1703 to the John Guest a lott in the afore said Square bounded on the East with the third Street, on the South wth the ends of ~~the~~ Sassafras Street lots, on ye West wth the fourth Street and on the North wth the Remaining part of the said Square belonging also ^{to} the said John Guest being in Breadth on the 3^d and 4th Streets one hundred and fifty foot and in Length from the said third Street to the fourth three hundred and ninety six feet.

Together wth the the Northermost part of the said Square bounded on the East wth Third Street, on the South wth the aforesaid lott (of the ^{sd} Jn^o Guest) on the West wth the fourth Street and on the North wth Vine Street being in Breadth on third & fourth Streets two hundred and eighty foot and in length from the third Street to the fourth three hundred and ninety six foot.
