



William Penn, Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of Pennsylvania & ye Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye Request of John Swift & Joseph Jones, yt I would grant y<sup>m</sup> to take up ye Remainder of their Purchase of one Thousand Acres of Land being Three hundred Eighty (obl.) Acres in ye County of Philadelphia. These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be surveyed unto them, ye 5<sup>d</sup> Number of Acres in ye aforementioned County where not already taken up according to ye Method of Townships appointed by me, they seating & improveing the same w<sup>th</sup> in six Months and make returns there into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia ye (obl.) 4<sup>th</sup> of ye 4<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1684.
