At the Request of Thomas Story Attorney to Joseph Pike of the Kingdom of Ireland Merch^t. That we would Grant him to take up the Remainder not yet taken up or Granted of five Thousand Acres of Land in this Province purchased by the Said Joseph Pike of Sam^l Pells of the sd Kingdom Original Purchaser of the Said quantity from the Proprietary; These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey to the sd Joseph Pike according to the Method of Townships appointed Seven Hundred Acres of Land (over & above the like quantity granted by our Warr^t of Yesterday's Date in part of the sd Remainder) where it hath not been already Surveyed nor taken up, nor is Conceald nor Seated by the Indians: And make Returns thereof into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delv^d to thee certified by the Secretary: Given under our Hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the first day of y^e Tenth Month 1702
