Whereas by our Warrant bearing date ye 11th day of December Anno 1719 We Authorized thee to Survey unto Sarah Stevenson Felict & Execut^{ix} of Thomas Stevenson late of ye County of Bucks Decd fifteen Hundred Acres of ^{Land} in the Province in Right & as a part of five Thousand Acres the purchase of Thomas Hudson whose Attorney W^m Biles in his life time Convey'd ye Same unto John Talman (& others of Long Island) who by his Deed Poll dated ye 11th of ye Month called June 1719 Convey'd ye Said 1500 Acres ye Said Tho: Stevenson And Whereas by one other Warrt of even date with ye afores'd Warrt We also Authorize thee to Survey unto ye Sd Sarah Stevenson one Thousand Acres further in part of ye Said 5000 Acres which ye said W^m Biles as Attorney to ye said Tho. Hudson convey'd unto Joseph Thorn of Long Island aforesd who by two Deeds Poll dated ye 25th of July ~~ye~~ 1718 & ye 11th of June 1719 Convey'd ye sd 1000 Acres unto ye said Tho: Stevenson And Whereas by another Warrt of ye Same date with ye afore-going Warrt We likewise Authorized thee to survey unto ye sd Sarah Stevenson one Thousand Acres further in part of ye Sd 5000 Acres which ye sd W^m Biles as Attorney aforesd Convey'd to Benj Field of Long Island aforesd. who by Deed Poll dated ye 11th of ye fourth Month 1719 Convey'd the Same to ye sd. Thomas Stevenson And Whereas by one other Warrt of ye Same date wth ye forementioned Warrts We also Authorized thee to Survey to ye Sd Sarah Stevenson five Hundred Acres further in part of ye sd 5000^{as} w^{ch} ye sd W^m Biles Atty as aforesd Convey'd to W^m Lawrence of Long Island aforesd who by his Deed Poll dated ye 11th of June 1719 Convey'd ye Sd 500 Acres to the Said Thomas Stevenson And Whereas it appears that ye sd 5000 Acres ye purchase of Tho. Hudson aforesd. were formerly laid out in ye County of Bucks near ye line w^{ch} divides ye Said County from ye County of Philad^a But by some mistake of ye Surveyor in locating ye Same about three Thousand Acres there of were run into a tract theretofore Survey'd to one Dennis Rockford whose Heirs or their Assignes have since taken & do hold the Same by Virtue of a prior Survey to that of ye sd Tho: Hudson, so that the Assignees of Tho. Hudson cannot enjoy ye Sd Survey. These are therefore to Authorize & require thee forth with to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto ye sd Sarah Stevenson ind^{ist} of ye said Tho. Hudsons purchase the Several quantities of Land above mentioned Containing together four Thousand Acres including within ye Same so much of ye first Survey made to ye Sd Tho: Hudson w^{ch} remains Clear of ye lines of ye Assignees of Dennis Rockford and impleat ye Said quantities out of Vacant Lands according to ye Method of Townships and ^(as they) ke Exact returns into ye Secret^{rys} Office. Given under our hands & ye lesser Seal of ye Province at Philad^a ye 14th day of ~~Sept~~ 1720
