At the Request of Edward Shippen that We would Grant him to take <sup>up</sup> the quantity of four Hundred & Eighty Six Acres and two third parts of an Acre of Land in this Province in part of the Original purchase of two Thousand Acres made of the Proprietor by Charles Jones Sen<sup>r</sup> and Charles Jones Jun<sup>r</sup> of the City of Bristol and left to the said Edward by the Last Will and Testament of his Grand Mother Esther Shippen late of the City of Philad<sup>a</sup> who together with her late Husband Edward Shippen by Deeds of Lease & Release dated ye 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> days of November Anno -1711 purchased the whole of the said Charles Jones Sen<sup>r</sup> who survived Charles Jones Jun<sup>r</sup>. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Edward Shippen within the said Province According to the Method of Townships <sup>appointed</sup> the said Quantity of four Hundred Eighty Six Acres and two Third parts of an Acre <sup>of Land</sup> which hath not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation. Given under our Hands & the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 20<sup>th</sup> of ye 3<sup>d</sup> Month A.D. 1725.
