

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1700. I do hereby certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto George Smedley a Tract of Land in the Township of Dublin in the County of Philadelphia which was formerly laid out in two several Tracts to Thomas Kitchin and John Goodin by virtue of two several Warrants under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour directed to Thomas Holme then Surveyor General, that to Thomas Kitchin bearing date the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month 1683 and that to John Goodin the 19<sup>th</sup> day of 4<sup>th</sup> month 1684 each for one hundred acres now in possession of the said George Smedley one moiety thereof by right of the said John Goodins Widow and the other moiety by purchase from the said Thomas Kitchin. Beginning at a corner stake set in the ground being a corner dividing it from the Land Thomas Madocks bought of Thomas Fairman from thence by a Line of marked trees North East five hundred and ten perches to a stake set in the ground in the Line of Joseph Fishers Land from thence by the said Fishers Line of marked trees South East sixty seven perches to a stake set in the ground dividing it from the Land of Richard Hilliard from thence by the said Hilliard's Line of marked trees South West five hundred and ten perches to another stake set in the ground from thence by a Line of marked trees North West sixty and seven perches to the place of begining containing and laid out for two hundred and thirteen Acres and ninety perches of Land. Resurveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1700 and Returned according to the above said survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's Office the 23<sup>d</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1700
