west one hundred and seventy perches to a another Stak<sup>e</sup> in the  
Line of ye Said William Robarts from thenc<sup>e</sup> by a Line of marked trees  
North Ninty four<sup>e</sup> <sup>& a q<sup>t</sup></sup> perches to the first mentioned Gume tree Con-  
taining and Laid out for one hundred acres of Land the 4<sup>th</sup> of ye  
6 m<sup>o</sup> Ensueing ye Dat<sup>e</sup> above sd Pr<sup>o</sup> me
