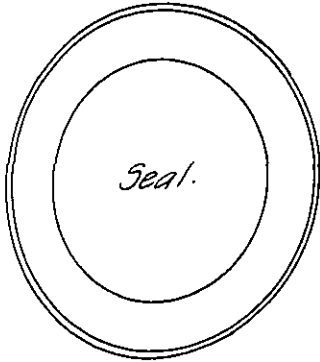


Pennsylvania Is.



By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon the humble Request of Martin Chartier (who by the Commissioners Licence Seated himself on Sasquahanah River above Conestogo Creek) that we would grant him a Survey on three hundred acres ^{of Land} including within y^e same the Improvement there made by him for which he agrees on behalf of his Son Peter Chartier in whose name he desires the said Survey to be made & returned, to pay to y^e Propriet^{rs} Use ^{mony of Pennsylvania} Thirty pounds ^{for the whole} and the yearly Quit-rent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Peter Chartier on the said River Sasquahanah where the said Martin is seated according to y^e Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Three hundred acres of Land that hath not ~~been~~ already been Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Martin or Peter fulfill the above agreement by paying down the said thirty pounds within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 2^d day of the 11th Month Anno Din. 1717.
